RESIDENT YOUTH APPLICATION

This Youth Scholarship Program provides scholarship opportunities to High School Seniors or Graduates who are entering their first year of post-secondary education and reside in or receive direct housing benefits from an agency or authority that is in good standing with Arkansas Chapter of NAHRO.

The Scholarship has been established by the Arkansas Chapter of NAHRO to provide the opportunity for Resident Youths who live in Public Housing, Section 8 Housing, or other Housing Programs to take advantage of post high school educational opportunities. This scholarship should be used for fall and/or spring semesters only. Summer school is not eligible. The scholarship will be paid directly to the winner after confirmation of enrollment in a college, university or vocational school is received. Confirmation of enrollment must be received within eighteen (18) months of award of scholarship.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- 1) The Applicant and his/her family must reside in or receive direct housing benefits from the housing authority or agency for his/her entire senior year and/or at least twelve (12) months prior to application deadline.
- 2) The Applicant must commit himself or herself to enrolling in a college, university or vocational school beyond high school graduation.
- 3) The Applicant must have maintained an overall 2.5 grade point average for the total of his/her high school career.

This scholarship program is competitive and will be awarded based on academic achievements, extra-curricular school activities and community involvement.

1. All available and most recent high school transcript (including current grades).
2. ACT Test Scores.
3. Two or more letters of recommendation from teachers/counselor.
4. An essay (300 words or less) on why the applicant wishes to pursue a college degree or vocational training. Essay must be typed or in own handwriting.
